

## Preparation before the training

### Checklist for organizer of the training or the trainer:

- Identify needs of the trainees, i.e. gaps in knowledge or communication skills
- Are there specialized services for women and children GBV?

- Is there a law/definition on domestic violence or sexual violence in your country?

- Is DV subject of private or public prosecution?
- Is there a restraining order, is it applied?
- Is there cooperation between social services and police, do they provide a lawyer?
- What happens when a survivor comes severely injured to a hospital/shelter/etc.?
- Are there perpetrator services?
- Is there prevention and awareness raising of GBV you can refer to in the training?
- Are there local myths (e.g. provocation of violence)
- Who are the relevant migrant and minority groups in your region?
- For the section on regional statistics, try to find national data to illustrate the relevance of the problem:
  - Number of crisis calls
  - Number of arrests and femicides
  - Number of requests for emergency shelter or victim services, victims turned away, etc.
